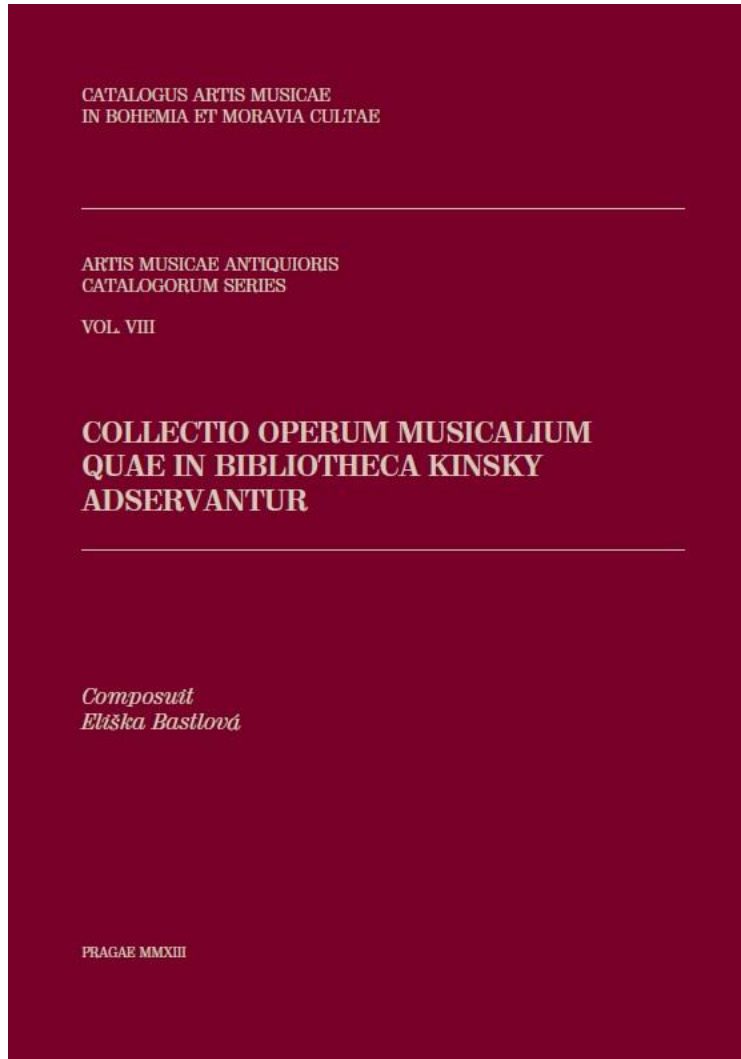

- music collections of the **Czech provenance**
- **manuscripts and prints** of the **18th and first half of the 19th century**
- all included in the **RISM**
- **sacred music** (e. g. collections from monasteries and churches), **secular music** (aristocratic archives and libraries)
- thematic catalogues prepared in close cooperation with **RISM** since **2013**

E. Bastlová: The thematic catalogue of the music collection of Kinsky library (2013)



- first examined in 2010
- administered by the **National Museum Library** in Prague (CZ-Pn)
- more than **1,000 individual music documents**
- dating ca **1775–1850**
- **373 music manuscripts; 274 music prints**
- exclusively **secular music**
- used both for **study purposes** (vocal solfeggios, instrumental exercises, piano solos), **Carnival dance music of Prague balls**, chamber music etc.

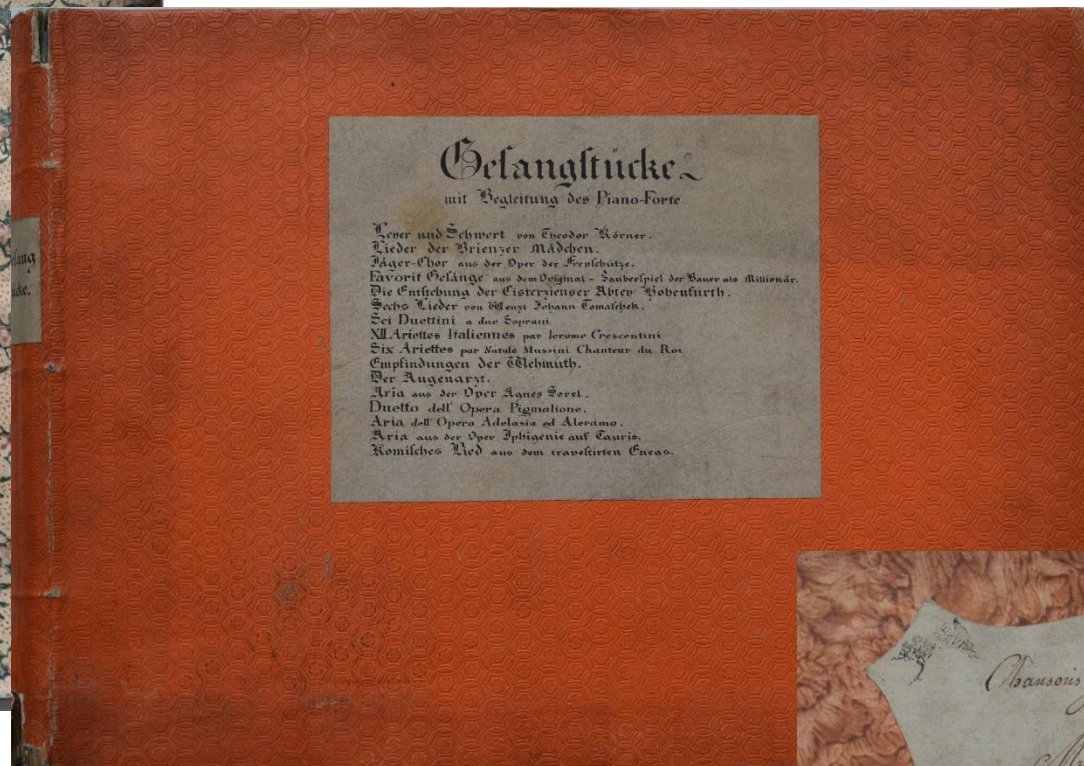

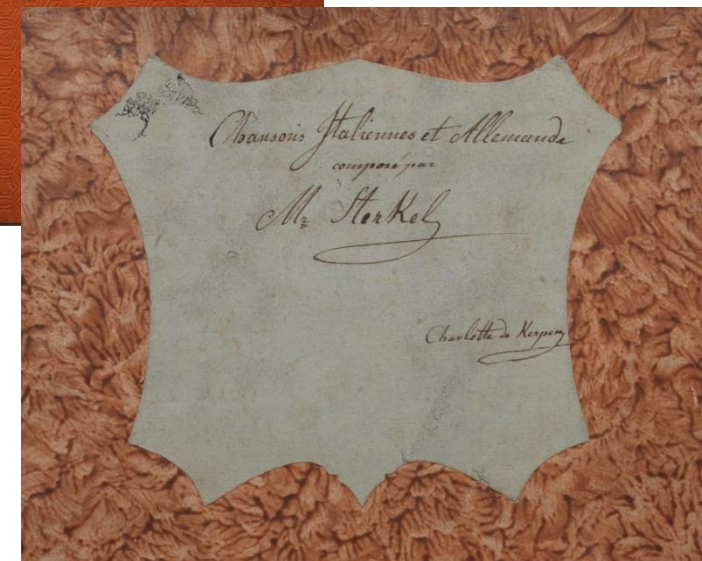


W. A. Mozart: *Cosi fan tutte* (short score, Anton Grams' Prague copyist workshop)

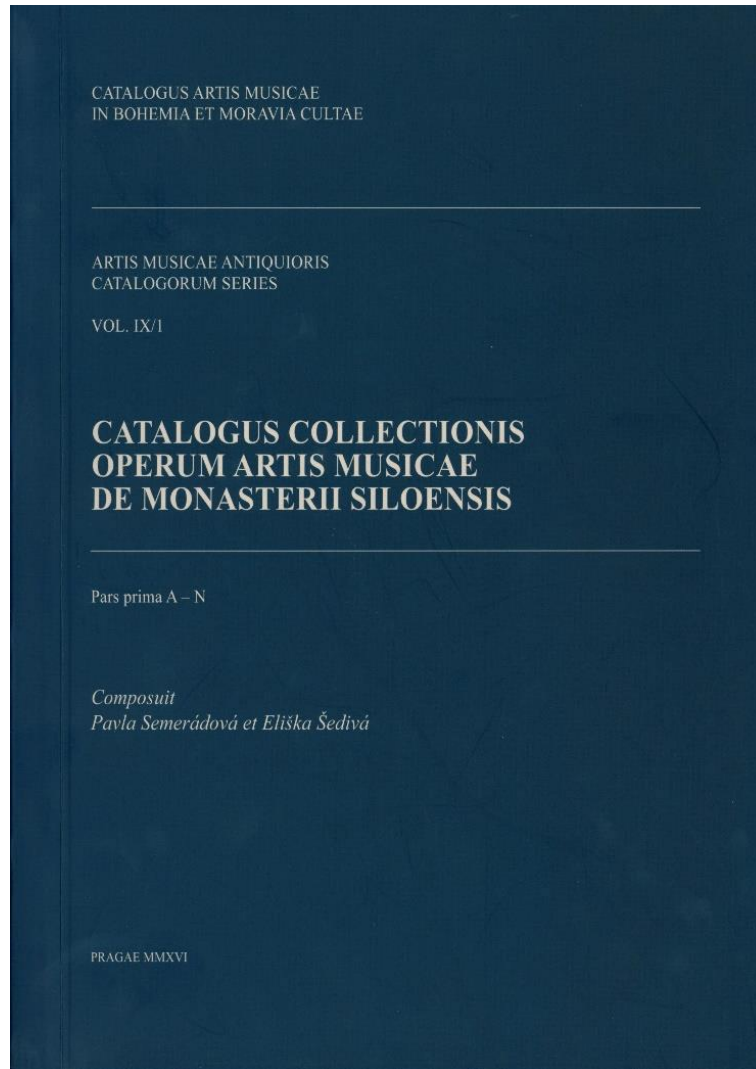

Monastery in Želiv, copperplate, J. A. Mansfeld, Prague before 1738

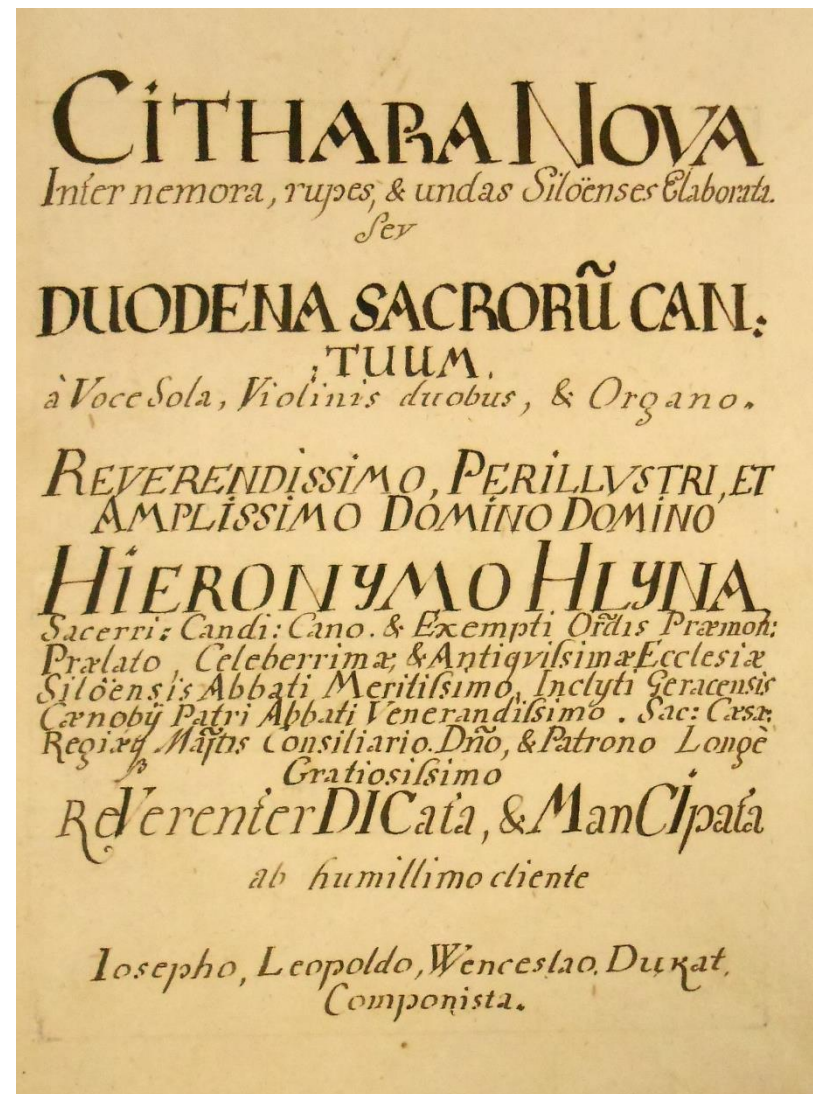

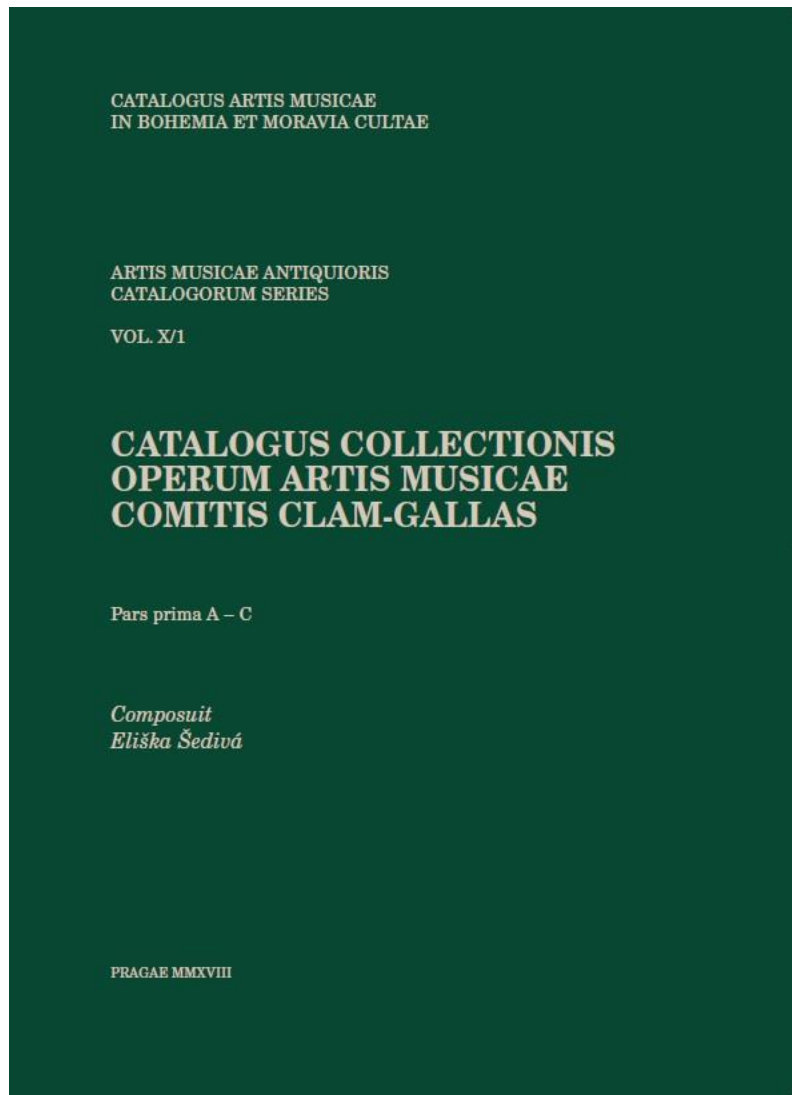

Josef Leopold Václav DUKÁT (1684–1717)

- Czech composer
- came to the Želiv Monastery in around 1707
- 1707 collection of cantatas entitled *Cithara nova* for Abbot Hieronymus Hlina
- **new type of ecclesiastical cantata composed under the influence of the Neapolitan style**

- music archive of the château ensemble and wind harmony of **Count Christian Phillip Clam-Gallas** (1748–1805) and the private collection of vocal (especially operatic) music owned by his wife **Maria Caroline Josepha Clam-Gallas** (born Sporck) (1752–1799)
- total of **2,223 individual works** (1,572 shelfmarks including albums and convolutes)
- **music manuscripts and prints**
- **predominantly from abroad**
- some of **domestic provenance**
- **ca 1750–1820**

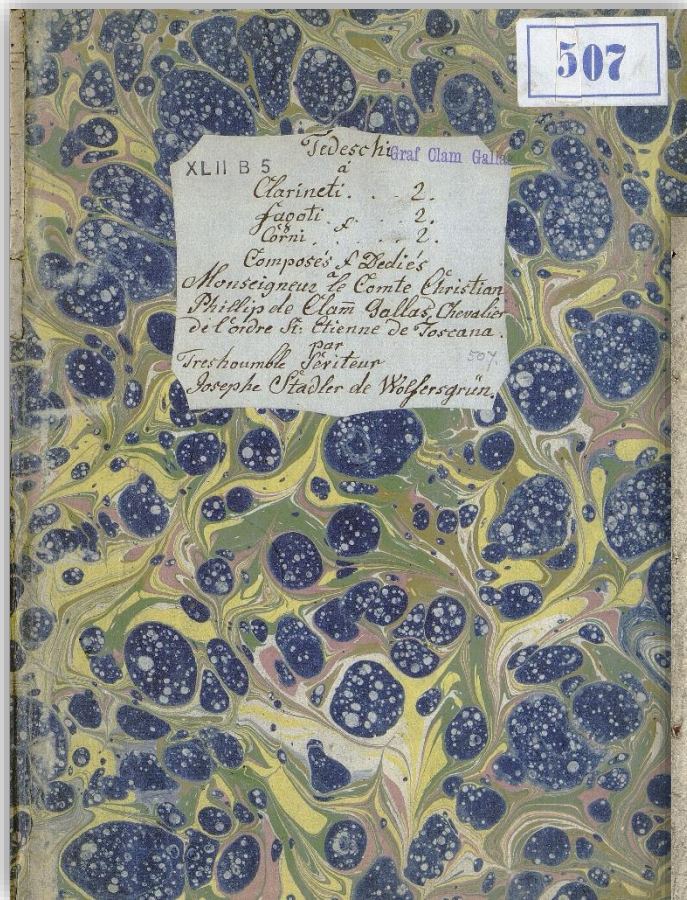

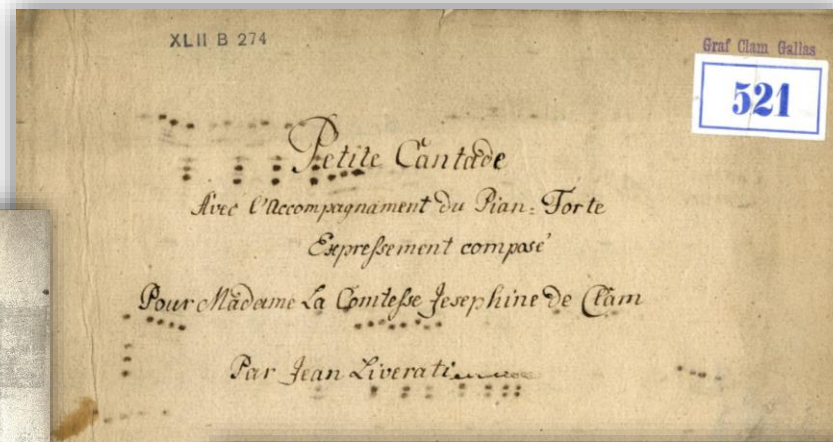
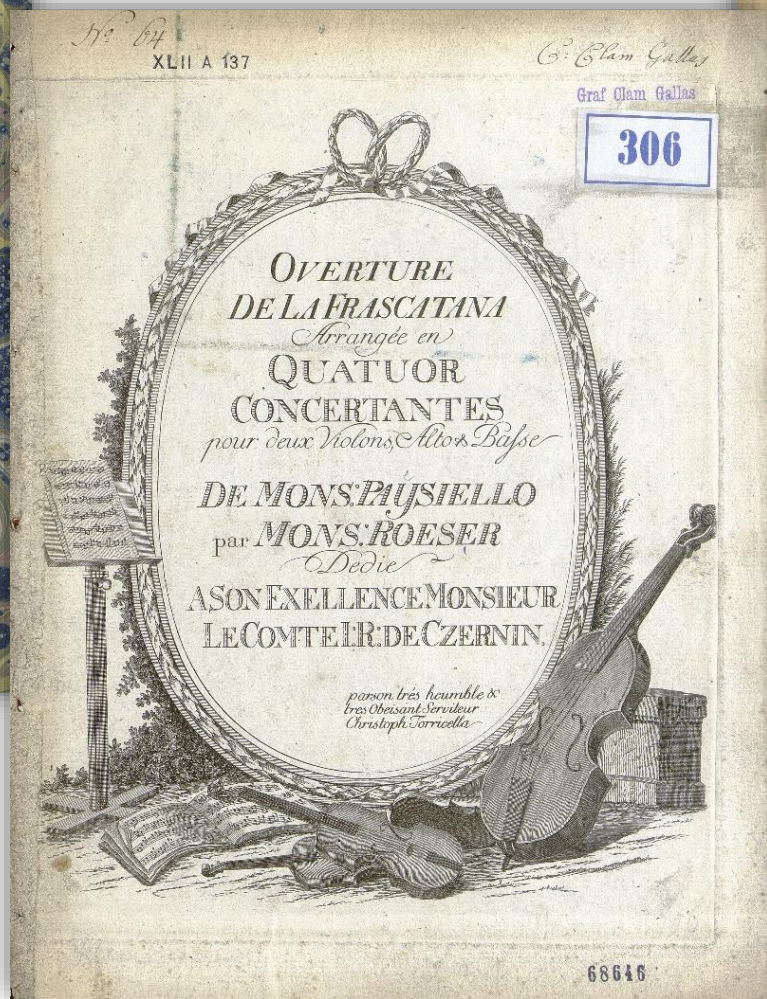

- the arrival of the aristocratic House of **Ubelli von Siegburg** at the beginning of the 18th century
- the musical performances at the **Koleč château** unfortunately **undocumented**

- **Pater Barnabas Weiss, OFMCap (1815–1899)**
- **Ladislav Vycpálek**, founder of Music Department at the National Library of the CR (CZ-Pu), **purchased the collection from the Capuchins in 1923**
- **music manuscripts** (c1775–1899) (**57 shelfmarks** and **174 entries** in the thematic catalogue)
- **printed sheet music** (c1840–1880) (**146 shelfmarks, 361 entries**)
- **sacred music** (associated with the music performed at Saint Joseph's Church, especially the concerts held during the period of Easter)
- **piano extracts of vocal-instrumental masses**
- **polyphonic spiritual works** (B. Cordans, J. K. Kerll, A. Lotti, A. Scarlatti, G. P. da Palestrina and T. L. de Victoria)
- **operatic works** (Mozart, Cimarosa, Gluck, Rossini etc.); **symphonic music and string quartets** (J. Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven)
- **ensemble or solo works set to secular texts** (Beethoven, Mendelssohn Bartholdy, Mozart, Schubert, Schumann etc.)

- **Joannes Nepomucenus Aloysius Carolus Weiss (1815–1899)**, („Barnabas“ is his monastic name)
- **well known as an active musician** (cellist and viola player)
- **respected personality in Prague’s social life**
- **he organised musical productions** at both St Joseph’s Church and the monastery
- **he held concerts there in the 1860s and 1870s** that became an important part of Prague’s musical life due to their **dramaturgy, artistic quality and social impact**

Capuchin Saint Joseph’s Monastery on the former Joseph Square (Josefské náměstí) in **Prague’s New Town.**

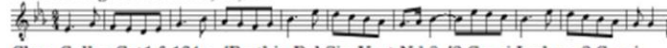

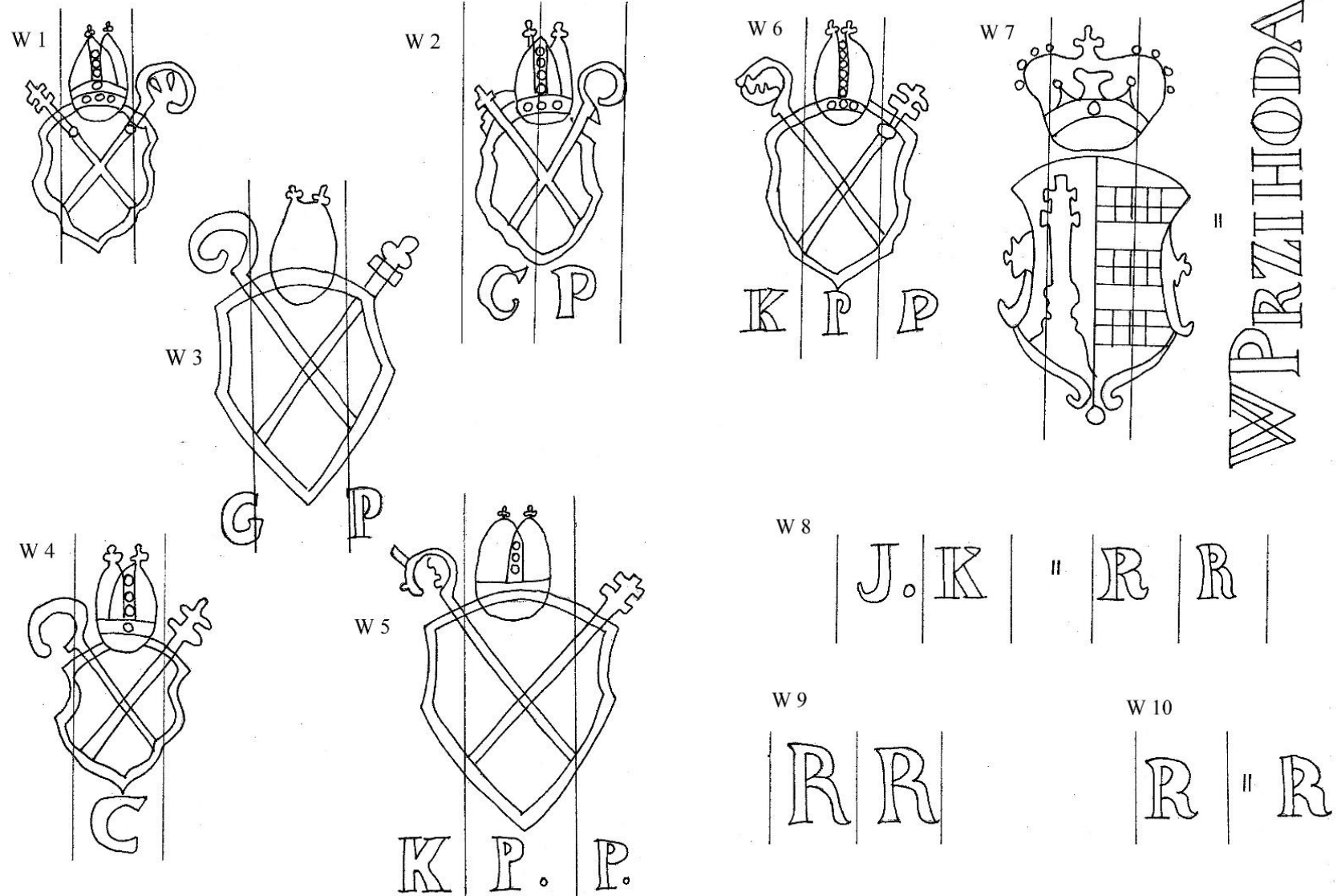
